## Midhurst – the town and its heritage

Midhurst has great historical social and political significance – Cowdray played host to both Queen Elizabeth I and King Henry VIII. Guy Fawkes once worked at the house, which later caused the Montague Family to be implicated in the Gunpowder Plot of 1605. Then, in the Civil War, the Parliamentarians used the house as a Roundhead barracks. Partially destroyed by fire in 1793, the magnificent ruins now tower over the town's water meadows and visitors can explore where Kings and Queens of England once stood.

the core around which modern Midhurst developed. South Pond came next, built to supply fish to the castle on St Ann's Hill. Walk on from there and you'll find a delightful mix of medieval, Georgian, Victorian and Edwardian architecture, including more than 100 listed buildings.

### Literary Inspiration

Thanks to HG Wells, Anya Seton and Ruth Rendell, the walk around town can also lead you into different worlds – just imagine yourself as The Invisible Man, a Tudor heroine or even the great Inspector Wexford! The town has also provided inspiration to writers as diverse as Hillaire Belloc and John Wyndham.

### Midhurst Town Trail

A stroll around the Midhurst Town Trail (leaflet available at Visitor Information points) reveals an even older side to the town – starting on St Ann's Hill. First an Iron Age fort, then a centre of pagan worship, a Norman castle and finally a 12th century fortified house, this was



# The South Downs National Park

Midhurst nestles at the centre of the South Downs National Park and makes the perfect base to get out and explore this beautiful landscape.

### Incredible Wildlife

The surrounding countryside provides habitats for an amazing range of wildlife. On open chalk grassland, wild flowers like the honey-scented musk orchid and horseshoe vetch thrive, attracting clouds of butterflies in the summer, including the glorious Adonis Blue.

Midhurst, Woolbeding, Iping and Stedham Commons are all nearby. Here you will find unique heathland with wide horizons and intimate, secluded places. You might also see rare birds such as the nightjar and woodlark, as well as reptiles and insects (like the long-horned beetle) that thrive in the heather and gorse.

### Walk, Cycle, Ride

The walking trails around Midhurst are another great way to discover the local wildlife. The Serpent Trail starts in Haslemere and snakes across the National Park past Petersfield, Midhurst and Petworth. The three-mile Woolbeding Walk offers a more leisurely stroll along the River Rother with its wetlands, dragonflies and even the occasional kingfisher. To experience the wildlife at its best, why not arrange a guided tour at twilight with an experienced countryman (contact Cowdray Park Golf Club to find out more).

For the more energetic, the South Downs Way is a must. This iconic National Trail runs past the village of Cocking, just a few miles south of Midhurst, and offers walkers, horse riders and cyclists breathtaking, panoramic views of the countryside.

# Sporting and leisure activities


## Outdoors

Play championship golf at Cowdray Park Golf Club (children most welcome on the practise tee for lessons or just for fun). Discover the challenge of clay pigeon shooting with lessons suitable for the novice or accomplished shot (all equipment provided). Experience the beauty of the River Rother while fly fishing – day tickets are available for visitors (from the Post Office in Midhurst and Easebourne Stores) and lessons can be arranged with Cowdray Park’s resident ghillie. Alternatively discover the freedom and exhilaration of exploring the area by bicycle or on horseback.

## Indoors

The newly built Grange Centre offers squash and badminton courts, drop-in exercise classes and a well-equipped gym. There’s an indoor climbing wall at Midhurst Rother College that’s open to the public and suitable for all levels from beginner to advanced. Yoga, Pilates and meditation classes are also available at Cowdray Hall – a range of beautiful rooms away from the bustle of busy daily lives.

Tour magnificent historic buildings (and their surrounding grounds) including Petworth House, Arundel Castle, Chichester Cathedral, Goodwood House and Stansted House or be inspired by the amazing gardens at West Dean.

Take a turning off the main roads and explore the road-less-travelled! Along the way, discover the many charming villages that surround Midhurst, all of which have their own special charms – including award-winning village shops and breweries and a multitude of wonderful country pubs.

### Travel through culture, time and space

Discover the many specialist museums and galleries the South Downs has to offer, including Weald and Downland Open Air Museum, Fishbourne Roman Palace, Pallant House Gallery of 20th Century Art, Cass Sculpture Foundation,

Tangmere Military Aviation Museum and South Downs Planetarium. Catch one of Chichester Festival Theatre's world-class productions in their newly refurbished theatre.

### Outstanding Coastline

For a change in scenery, why not explore our magnificent coastline? Take to a boat to discover the delights of Chichester Harbour or investigate the RSPB nature reserves around Wittering, Selsey and Bracklesham Bay.

### Horses and Horsepower

Thrill at the thunder of hooves, the roar of engines and incredible aerial displays at one of Goodwood's many internationally-renowned events. There's the Festival of Speed, Goodwood Revival and Glorious Goodwood to name just a few.

## The National Trust in the South Downs

The National Trust cares for over 15,000 acres of the South Downs, protecting beautiful landscapes and rare wildlife alongside stunning houses and gardens rich in history and colour.

West of Midhurst is Uppark – a Georgian mansion packed with beautiful furnishings. Seek out the incredible 18th-century doll's house, and relax on lawns overlooking glorious views of the South Downs. If you like gardens, you'll love Hinton Ampner – just 30 minutes from Midhurst – filled with scent and colour and a delightful walled kitchen garden. The gardens lead on to historic parkland and woodland, which is carpeted with bluebells in spring.

The chalk grassland, ancient woodlands and heaths are wonderful destinations for walks. Head out of Midhurst along the Rother Valley and through the parkland into the Woolbeding countryside where you can experience the wild commons

and a myriad of wildlife, from Dartford warblers to dragonflies. At the heart of the estate lies a little-known horticultural jewel, Woolbeding Gardens, packed with floral borders and follies.

The South Downs Way passes through Harting Down nature reserve. Hear skylarks bursting with song above you and tread on grassland awash with pyramidal orchids. Of historical interest is an Iron Age hill fort and cross-ridge dykes. The remains of a Napoleonic war telegraph station can be found on Beacon Hill, the highest point on Harting Down.

## Places to eat

There's an amazing array of places to eat in and around Midhurst. No matter whether you're after low-key and informal or something rather smarter, you're sure to find somewhere that fits the bill.

### In Midhurst:

You will find everything from al fresco eating in the newly refurbished Market Square (a great place to take a break while walking the Town Trail), cream teas in medieval surroundings and Spanish tapas right through to modern British fine dining.

There are also a multitude of independent cafés and teashops as well as restaurants featuring cuisine from all corners of the globe.

### Out of Town:

Here the traditional country pub really comes in to its own – but think beyond conventional English pub grub or gastropubs. Instead expect gardens with great views of the Downs, cosy log fires in winter and landlords who keep great cellars and serve great food. The farmland of the South Downs is a fantastic resource so look out for plenty of locally sourced ingredients on the menus.

Locally sourced ingredients are also a feature at the award-winning Cowdray Farm Shop & Café on the outskirts of Midhurst. In store there is a traditional butchery with much of the meat coming from the Cowdray Home Farm, a comprehensive deli counter with a range of artisan cheeses and a selection of charcuterie.


